he PHC is thrilled to open two new Coalition Health Centers (CHC) in the Tri-Cities area and Spokane! Dedicated to the Coalition member plans, the CHCs will offer affordable, high-quality primary, acute, and preventive health services to their plan participants.

Patients will have access to services for urgent medical needs, primary care, chronic conditions, and preventative care. The clinics will provide onsite medication dispensing, labs, and on-call services to members of plans that choose to participate. Preventative care will include annual screenings, adult and pediatric well-care, and vaccinations. The CHCs will offer same day appointments, minimal wait times, and after-hours care.

These clinics are another way
Coalition member plans can easily
and affordably offer comprehensive
health care and peace of mind to
plan participants. There is no permember access fee because the PHC
pools the administrative costs among
participating member plans. Plan
participants may utilize any CHC
in their respective state.

Managed by Marathon Health, the Eastern Washington clinics will be staffed by licensed physicians, physician assistants and other health care providers.

ALASKA LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Key Issues and Legislative Developments

The 2025 Alaska legislative session has been marked by significant developments amid fiscal and social challenges. With over half the session completed by February, lawmakers grappled with a looming budget deficit driven by education spending, the Permanent Fund Dividend (PFD), and declining oil revenues. A key focus was Senate Bill 62 and House Bill 76, both under review in education committees, aiming to address school funding and expand correspondence programs for homeschoolers, though no resolution has been reached. Governor Dunleavy's January education proposal, offering one-time school funding, stirred debate over its policy additions

There are several pieces of legislation of interest this session that we are tracking. The first is SB 121 HEALTH INSURANCE ALLOWABLE CHARGES by Senator Cathy Giessel (R-Anchorage). The legislation would replace the repealed 80th percentile rule with a 75th percentile rule and requires that

insurers uniformly and equally apply reimbursement rates for the same type of health care service or supply and for health care providers who are practicing within the scope of their license. The second is SB 122 HEALTH INSURANCE NETWORK STANDARDS by Senator Cathy Giessel (R-Anchorage). It requires health care insurers to meet minimum provider network standards. If the insurer fails to meet minimum network standards. it must submit a plan for corrective action for consideration by the Director of Insurance. The bill is cumbersome and overly restrictive of Alaska's already limited-size market. Both bills are moving slowly through the committee process, and we will keep members updated on any progress.

Last session, the Legislature considered legislation concerning prior authorization that sought to implement a "gold card" program in Alaksa. Over the interim all the relevant stakeholders worked collaboratively to come to a

compromise, which led to the legislation currently being considered by the Legislature. SB 133 and HB 144 do not include a gold card program, but rather, focus on comprehensively reforming prior authorization. The bill targets reforms that will directly and positively impact patients, including establishing timelines for decisions, long term authorizations for chronic conditions, establishing an exemption process for step therapy and prioritizing automation and electronic submission for prior authorizations.

With the session's end on May 21, critical budget and education issues remained the focus, setting the stage for intense final negotiations in a state navigating economic constraints and historic legislative shifts. This session has been marked by concerted efforts to balance fiscal responsibility with strategic investments in education and infrastructure.

COMING JULY 1, 2025

Aetna Enhanced Claim and Code Review Program

Aetna is rolling out an enhanced Claim and Code Review Program otherwise (CCRP) to Joint Claims Administration (JCA) customers beginning July 1, 2025. CCRP creates additional savings for all those under the Aetna umbrella by applying expanded claim editing

technology to ensure coding accuracy. Although this program is not new to Aetna, investments were needed to configure the system to support JCA. CCRP is on a prepay basis which results in no delays for our TPA partners. As Aetna rolled this program

out, the Pacific Health Coalition negotiated a greater discount for our member groups, retaining 82% of the shared savings vs 70% which is Aetna's standard.

"With PHC membership, convenient care isn't just a buzzword," said Mergens. "It means more Railroaders are getting the care they need when they need it."
